UNION — When Matt Donohoo says “Word,” friends and family know the right response is “Up.”

Donohoo is known for his sense of humor, love of family, deep faith, community involvement, love of music and a “heart the size of the universe,” according to friend Kathy Griewahn.

Recently though, Donohoo began having symptoms of headaches and dizziness, and on March 15, it was discovered that he had a brain tumor which was surgically removed on March 20.

Because Donohoo has just begun a new job at Caterpillar in Clayton, his insurance and sick leave benefits have not yet kicked in.

Friends and family are springing into action to provide fundraising to assist the family through the hardship of medical bills and loss of income.

Several events that the community is invited to attend are planned to raise money for the

family’s expenses. On April 1 from 3 p.m. until close, TJ Chumps will donate 20 percent of all dine-in, carry-out, delivery and gift card purchases for those who bring in the flier supporting the cause.

Also on April 1 starting at 3 p.m., the BRD House is holding an event that includes live entertainment by local artists, a silent auction, baked goods and t-shirt sales.

On both April 6 from 5-8 p.m. and on April 21 all day, Chick-fil-A is holding an eat-in fundraiser. Participants need only bring in the flier to indicate that they are there in support of the Donohoo family.

A Facebook page has been started called Praying for the Donohoo Family. It has more than 700 members so far. From the Facebook page, those who would like to help out by providing meals for the family can log on to a web site called MealTrain.com. Those interested would register then choose a date to provide the meal and indicate what meal they intend to bring.
